Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund II and III (HEERF II & III) Report CRRSAA/HEERF II Section 314(a) (4) and American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act/HEERF III Section 2003(a) (4)

The Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) is comprised of the 2020 Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES Act), or HEER I; **the 2021 Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA), or HEERF II; and the 2021 American Rescue Plan (ARP), or HEERF III.**

The following information is provided to comply with the Department of Education's CRRSAA Act/HEERF II and ARP Act/HEEF III Reporting requirements.

Quarterly Report (OCT 2021 to DEC 2021, ending December 31, 2021)-As of JAN 10, 2022

1. An acknowledgement that the institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA/HEERF II and ARP/HEERF III programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

Angeles College signed and submitted the Certification and Agreement on January 29th, 2021 with the assurance that Angeles College shall provide no less than 100% of the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations (CRRSAA)/HEERF II for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students with exceptional need who have been negatively impacted by financial disruptions due to the COVID-19 pandemic. As Angeles College was a recipient of HEERF II 314(a)(1) of the CRRSAA, we were not required to submit a new application in connection with **HEERF III**; rather, a Certification and Agreement was signed and returned to the Department of Education.

2. The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA/HEERF II and ARP/HEERF III programs.

Angeles College received \$218,031 from the federal government for the CRRSAA/HEERF II (February 17, 2021) and \$133,037 from the American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act (August 5, 2021), total of \$351,068.

3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under the CRRSAA/HEERF II and ARP/HEERF III programs.

As of December 31st, 2021, \$218,031 of that money has been distributed in CRRSAA/HEERF II and \$39,569 under the ARP/HEERF III program, total of \$257,600. As of January 6, 2022, \$42,669 has been distributed under ARP/HEERF III program, total distribution of \$260,700 from the CRRSAA/HEERF II and ARP/HEERF III programs.

During October 1 – December 31, 2021, Angeles College awarded a total of \$90,368 in CRRSAA/HEERF II and ARP/HEERF III. As of January 6, 2022, \$93,468 has been distributed under CRRSAA/HEERF II and ARP/HEERF III program.

During October 1 – December 31, 2021, Angeles College awarded \$51,831 in CRRSAA/HEERF II.

During October 1 – December 31, 2021, Angeles College awarded \$39,569 in the ARP/HEERF III. As of January 6, 2022, \$42,669 has been distributed under ARP/HEERF III program.

4. The estimated total number of students at the institution that are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA/HEERF II and ARP/HEERF III programs.

Based on the student eligible parameters included in HEERF II & III and additional certification directives provided by the Department of Education, Angeles College estimates approximately 251 were eligible for consideration for emergency grant funding.

5. The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under the CRRSAA/HEERF II & ARP/HEERF III programs.

During September 1 – December 31, 2021, there were 219 students who have been awarded emergency grant funds under the CRRSAA/HEERF II & ARP/HEERF III. As of January 6, 2022, there were 226 students who have been awarded emergency grant funds under the CRRSAA/HEERF II & ARP/HEERF III.

6. The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under the CRRSAA/HEERF II and ARP/HEERF III programs.

CRRSAA/HEERF II & ARP/HEERF III programs

CRRSAA Section 314(d)(7) stipulates that awards be used only for financial assistance to students whose cost of attendance or emergency costs have been negatively affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. Examples of such costs include, but are not limited to, tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care), child care, and other education-related expenses.

Angeles College utilizes the following guidelines to identify eligible students with the most urgent need for the CRRSAA and ARP Section (a)(4) relief program:

Eligible Students

- Undergraduate or graduate degree or non-degree (certificate) seeking students who were enrolled in in the **Fall Quarter 2021 (for degree programs)** or in the **current term (for certificate programs)**.
- Students who were enrolled exclusively in online programs.
- Must be current students who are participating in courses actively and who are in good standing. Be enrolled with our college when an application is submitted.
- Included are students who were on an approved Leave of Absence.

Unlike with CARES/HEERF I distribution, CRRSAA/HEERF II and ARP/HEERF III guidance requires institutions to prioritize students with exceptional need. Because CRRSAA/HEERF II and ARP/HEERF III prioritizes domestic students with “exceptional need”, eligible students were identified by reviewing students’ Expected Family Contribution (EFC as determined on your official FAFSA). CRRSAA/HEERF II and ARP/HEERF III emergency grant amounts were determined by the student’s EFC according to the table below. Students who are unable to submit the FAFSA or California Dream Act Application (CADAA) who meets eligibility criteria are awarded \$100 regardless their enrollment status (FT, TT, HT, or LL). Students with undetermined EFC or unable to submit either applications are also awarded \$100.

Awards range from a maximum of \$700 to the minimum of \$100 and were given to students after Angeles College - CRRSA Act emergency grant committee’s review and approval of the submitted application.

Important Note: The Department of Education encourages institutions to prioritize domestic students, especially undergraduates, in allocating this funding. Domestic students include citizens, permanent residents, refugees, asylum seekers, DACA recipients, other DREAMers, and similar undocumented students. If the limited funds are remaining (unable to award all eligible applicants), domestic students will take priority.

Instructions and guidance were provided to eligible students identified by the Registrar's Office (via Angeles College email account and/or personal email address on file), along with the subsequent application via student's email. The application certifies that eligible students had incurred expenses from the components listed above because of the Coronavirus pandemic.

In accordance with the Department of Education guidelines, upon successful submittal of the application, Angeles College notified students of their status via their Angeles College email account and/or personal email address as identified on their application. Funds were processed through accounts payable and students received a paper check (which was mailed to the address provided on the application). These Emergency Financial Aid Grants were not applied against existing account balances.

Angeles College signed and submitted the Certification and Agreement on January 29th, 2021 with the assurance that Angeles College shall provide no less than 100% of the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations (**CRRSAA**)/**HEERF II** for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students with exceptional need who have been negatively impacted by financial disruptions due to the COVID-19 pandemic. As Angeles College was a recipient of HEERF II 314(a)(1) of the CRRSAA, we were not required to submit a new application in connection with **HEERF III**; rather, a Certification and Agreement was signed and returned to the Department of Education.

As of September 30th, 2021, \$165,500 of that money has been distributed in CRRSAA/HEERF II and \$0 under the ARP/HEERF III program.

During July 1 – September 30, 2021, Angeles College awarded \$87,600 in CRRSAA/HEERF II. As of September 30th, 2021, total of \$165,500 has been distributed from CRRSAA/HEERF II.

During July 1 – September 30, 2021, Angeles College awarded \$0 in the ARP/HEERF III. As of September 30th, 2021, total of \$0 was distributed from ARP/HEERF III.

Based on the student eligible parameters included in HEERF II & III and additional certification directives provided by the Department of Education, Angeles College estimates approximately 285 were eligible for consideration for emergency grant funding.

During July 1 – September 30, 2021, there were 162 students who have been awarded emergency grant funds under the CRRSAA/HEERF II.

Award amounts are based on each student's EFC value. Awards for the period covered range from a maximum of \$700.00 to a minimum of \$100.00.
